Dear Friends.

As we welcome the New Year 2025, I wish you abundant health, happiness, good fortune, and success in all your endeavors.

I am delighted to share with you the latest Maison Chance Newsletter, featuring updates on our new projects, ongoing programs, and heartwarming stories from the second half of 2024.

This year, we achieved significant milestones at Maison Chance Dak Nong, completing three major projects: a music room, an agricultural processing facility, an IT room, and a multisensory room for members with intellectual disabilities. We also began constructing a new kindergarten.

In the music room, children are excitedly exploring a variety of instruments. After familiarizing themselves with guitars, bass guitars, keyboards, and drums, they can choose an instrument to focus on and attend music theory lessons three times a week.

The agricultural processing facility has started producing coffee, pepper, cashews, peanuts, dried fruits, and lemongrass essential oil. Members with intellectual disabilities actively participate in these production processes, gaining a sense of purpose and self-worth through their contributions. Adjacent to the facility is the new computer room, which replaces the previous one in the library. Outdated equipment has been upgraded with a new set of computers, allowing students from our special education classes to access tailored educational programs designed for individuals with intellectual disabilities. This innovative approach aims to further develop the skills of children with autism, developmental delays, and other cognitive challenges.

The construction of the kindergarten began on November 12, 2024, and is expected to be completed by March 2025. Once finished, it will provide care and education for approximately 50 children aged six months to five years, including orphans living at the center and children from local families.

From late 2023 to the end of 2024, we organized eight gala nights across six countries to celebrate Maison Chance's 30th anniversary. These events began in Ontario and Montreal, Canada, continued in Washington, D.C., USA, and concluded in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, as well as across Europe in France, Switzerland, Belgium, and finally, Hanoi, Vietnam. I want to take this opportunity to extend my heartfelt thanks to the organizing committees and all our friends for their enthusiastic support and companionship.

As you may know, Maison Chance has associations abroad, and maintaining their activities, especially with support solely from volunteers, presents an ongoing challenge.

While some volunteers remain long-term, others eventually move on, leaving us with the task of finding new representatives in those countries. This is no easy task, as it requires individuals who are dynamic, compassionate, and committed to helping others on a voluntary basis.

I am deeply grateful for the unwavering support of so many kind-hearted individuals. As we look ahead to 2025, I am hopeful that we will collaborate with even more people who share our passion for making a difference. Together, we can continue to elevate Maison Chance and bring hope to more lives in need.

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WHEN DREAMS NEED TO TAKE WING



"I'm afraid I won't be able to go to school anymore," Uyen said softly, her words carrying a weight far beyond her seven tender years.

hu Nha Uyen, born in 2017 and part of the Nung ethnic group, is the youngest of three sis-ters. Her family, trapped in poverty, owns no farmland to sustain themselves. Uyen's parents were forced to leave their hometown to find work, leaving the three young sisters behind in a crumbling wooden house under the care of their grandparents, both over 70 years old. From a young age, the sisters learned to fend for themselves, preparing their own meals and looking after one another.

In 2022, tragedy struck when Uyen's father took his own life, leaving behind emotional scars and financial burdens. To cover the funeral costs, Uyen's mother borrowed heavily and returned to a distant job, leaving her children with their aging grandparents.

For Uyen's family, poverty is a relentless cycle with no apparent escape. Each meal is a struggle, and even simple necessities like notebooks and pens have become unaffordable luxuries. Her education hangs by a thread, with her mother unable to continue supporting her schooling. Uyen's quiet fear of losing her chance to learn reflects the unspoken cry of countless underprivileged children whose dreams are eclipsed by the weight of poverty.

In response to these challenges, Maison Chance welcomed Uyen to its Dak Nong center. Here, she has found a nurturing environment where her needs are met, her pain eased, and her dreams given a chance to thrive.

At Maison Chance, we strive to be a beacon of hope for children like Uyen. No child should have their aspirations crushed by poverty or endure such hardship in their formative years. Together, with the compassion and support of our community, we can give children like Uyen the opportunity to not only continue their education but also reclaim the joy of childhood and build a brighter future.

I would like to express my deepest and most sincere gratitude to the benefactors who have consistently supported and assisted Maison Chance and Mama Tim during this time.




EVENTS IN SWITZERLAND





ANCHOR OF LOVE A NEW KINDERGARTEN AT MAISON CHANCE DAK NONG

While it will serve the children living at the center, it will also welcome kids from disadvantaged families in the surrounding area, giving them a chance to learn, play, and thrive in a loving environment.

noezelen therapy is a sensory-based therapeutic approach designed to create a calming environment that integrates light, sound, scent, and touch. This method helps reduce stress and enhance interaction, particularly benefiting individuals with autism, hyperactivity, multiple disabilities, or psychological challenges.

Recently, three medical staff members and two specialized teachers from Maison Chance Dak Nong completed a comprehensive training course on Snoezelen therapy at Yersin Hospital in Nha Trang. The course was conducted by experts from France, providing participants with in-depth knowledge, specialized materials, and hands-on practice under expert guidance. The training program extends to the Children's Hospital and 1A Hospital in Ho Chi Minh City, where the team is gaining additional skills and practical experience to further enhance their therapeutic capabilities.

Maison Chance has already completed the construction of a Snoezelen room at its Dak Nong center. With the training now complete, the staffs are well-prepared to put their new knowledge into action. This initiative is expected to significantly improve the health and overall quality of care for the center's members, marking a meaningful step forward in their treatment journey.

This team will consists of one manager, four teachers, and a kitchen staff member, all committed to nurturing every aspect of the children's growth. The staff will strive to provide attentive care during meals, rest, and lessons.
